



1 timothy 4: Castaway

- Read I Timothy 4.
- Identify key terms that are repeated from chs. 1-3 (give heed, conscience, good, truth, godliness, etc). How are they used in ch. 4? What new insight does this give you?

KEY TERMS*

- GIVING HEED (vs. 1, 13)

Literally: to bring a ship near land.

Figuratively: to hold the mind, pay attention to, apply oneself to, adhere to (I Tim. 1:4).

- SEARED WITH A HOT IRON (vs. 3)

(Greek: *kausteriazō*) To mark by branding; of one whose soul is branded with the marks of sin, who carries with them the perpetual consciousness of sin. Implication: to render insensitive (I Tim. 1:1).

- SANCTIFIED (vs. 5)

To separate from things profane and dedicate to God; to consecrate. Used of things (as in I Tim. 4:5) and people; to make holy.

Read I Timothy 4:1-5 and chart or sketch the downward progression of sin in verses 1-2. Where does it start, how does it grow, and where does it end?

KEY TERMS*

CAREFULLY FOLLOWED (v. 6)

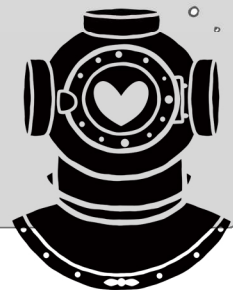
Literally: to follow near, to always be at one's side.
Figuratively: to follow up a thing in mind so as to attain to the knowledge of it. To follow faithfully a standard or rule, to conform one's self (2 Tim. 3:10).

EXERCISE (v. 7)

(Greek: *gymnazo*) To exercise vigorously in body or mind, to train. Used of one who strives earnestly to become godly.

EXHORTATION (v. 13)

A calling near; a summons for help. Includes exhortation, admonition, & encouragement.
