## KEY TERMS\*

BONDservANT (vs. 1)

(Greek: *doulos*) A slave, bondman, servant. Used as a verb in vs. 2, meaning to be a slave or to serve another.

FLEE (vs. 11)

To seek safety by taking flight; to shun.

PURSUE / FOLLOW AFTER (vs. 11)

To run swiftly in order to catch a person or thing. A metaphor for seeking eagerly or an earnest endeavor to acquire.

GAIN (vs. 5,6)

Acquisition or source of gain.

CONTENTMENT (vs. 6)

Perfect condition of life in which no aid or support is needed; a mind contented with its lot.

BE CONTENT (vs. 8)

To be possessed of unfailing strength; to be strong enough to defend or suffice; to be satisfied.

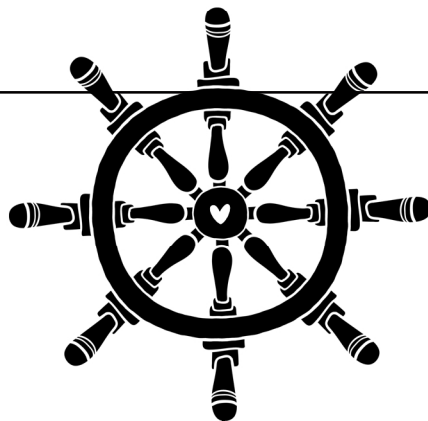
## 1 TIMOTHY 6:1-16
